<p>What do you like about being a member of Llysfaen Singers?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Fun/ singing together / pub afterwards (19) • Balance of discipline and freedom (2) • Welcoming / friendly / inclusive / meeting new people (16) • Great choice of songs (9) • Uplifting experience (3) • Superb professionals (6) • Local/community facility (6) • Like being asked for opinions on things eg what songs to sing, surveys (1) 	<p>It is pleasing to see that all members, without exception, thrive on the joy of singing together. New members often comment that they feel welcomed. Members enjoy the songs that we sing and find them uplifting and many commenting on the professionalism of our two expert musicians. They like the fact that we sing in and around the community and acknowledge the work done behind the scenes by the committee. They like the choice of songs; being asked for their opinions, especially on what songs to sing from the back catalogue or to suggest new songs, makes them feel valued.</p> <p>All observations made in the Members' Survey have been addressed or commented upon. Many have been incorporated into the Choir Improvement Plan (CIP) 2023/2024. Those observations that have been addressed previously and are now becoming embedded into normal practice, or which cannot be addressed, are commented upon in this column (see below)</p>

What aspect of Llysfaen Singers could be improved?

1. Tom could mouth the words/ improved bringing in (2)

We agreed some years ago (formalised in CIP 2022/2023 and in line with the recent Ty Cerdd grant) that there should be one song in Welsh or another language: similarly, songs with a classic Welsh melody, words in English. The majority of songs are chosen by members
14. Choice of songs to be sung is down to the choir members and Tom

15. The ‘wrong and strong’ ethos plus a greater number of sing-throughs were introduced in the CIP 2022/2023 and will become embedded into normal practice during the 2023/2024 year
16. Tom can give a list of providers for those who wish to undertake these
17. This cannot be accommodated as the width of the stage is not the same as the width of the hall
18. Uniform was introduced into the S&A sections for the first time Summer concert 2022

Improvement Plan 2023/ 2024

Commentary

A survey was undertaken in June 2023 to gauge the opinions of members on what they liked about Llysfen Singers; what aspect of the choir they thought could be improved; what was one thing about the choir that they would change. 66% of members completed the survey. Nearly all viewpoints have been taken into consideration and this Improvement Plan has been formulated from them. All ideas suggested by members not addressed in the Improvement Plan can be found in 'Comments in Response' (above).

 - Members are becoming more aware of phrasing and are often taking breaths at appropriate points in the music. This will be a focus on the music for the summer concert

 - Tom and Jay spent many hours ensuring all Christmas Concert music for all parts has been recorded, including pronunciation for Tua Bethlem Dref. This has been uploaded onto our Google drive account
3.
